Abstracts should be submitted only in English until May 30th at the following address: olympus2015@teicm.gr. Authors will be notified on the evaluation of their abstract until June 10th. The submission of the full version of manuscripts will be open until July 15th 2015. The manuscripts will be peer reviewed and the accepted papers will be included in the Olympus ICSC Proceedings.

Submitted abstracts and full version manuscripts should be written in Word 2007 or a newer version, using Arial 12 for the body of the text and Arial 14 for the headings. Detailed guidelines for authors can be found in conference website <http://olympusicsc.teicm.gr>.

The oral presentation can be done either in Greek or English although the presentation file (ppt) must be in English.
